Eight (8) x crimes were reported over this period:

Rothbury

Criminal Damage (Arson)

Occurred between Friday 16/05/14 and Sunday 18/05/14 at Beggars Rigg, Rothbury, when a wooden picnic bench

was damaged by fire. Police enquiries are continuing.

In summary, our priority is to focus on deterring and disrupting thefts from remote rural farms. Farming communities, please review your security, lock farm gates where possible, remove vehicle keys

and securely store property of value. Always be vigilant and report anything suspicious via the 999 emergency number.

The offenders are believed to be travelling criminals entering our area.

Police will continue to conduct static vehicle checks at key locations across Coquetdale, to deter such crimes.

If anyone has information on emerging crime or disorder, please contact Coquetdale Police. Our aim is to initiate early interventions and where necessary involve partners, to disrupt and prevent escalation.

Other issues:

- In relation to a previously reported damage to an ancient stone at Lordenshaw, a male (22 yrs) from the Whitton and Tosson Parish area admitted to causing the damage and was cautioned.
- Uninvited telephone calls or emails. Do not leave yourself vulnerable to scams. If concerned, simply hang up and do not reply.
- Uninvited door step callers. 'If in doubt, keep them out' Any concerns, contact Northumbria Police.
- At around 11pm on Sunday 25th May, a male (27 yrs) was spoken to by police in relation to throwing eggs at passing vehicles on Rothbury Front Street. He was subsequently interviewed and reported for the offence of disorderly conduct. The male is a local male from the Whitton and Tosson Parish area.

Dogs attacking sheep

On the evening of the 22nd of May a local resident was walking from Newtown to Newtown Park on the public footpath when he found a large cream coloured Husky type dog attacking a sheep. The degree of injury to the ewe was substantial and the vet who attended the incident advised that the sheep be put down. Local police officers contacted the dog's owner who reported that he had lost the dog when returning to his car at the Simonside car park. The dog, which was not on a lead, had chased a deer and disappeared. The ewe had two lambs and the cost of this incident amounts to several hundred pounds which is to be paid by the dog owner. The dog owner who is from Rothbury, has promised to keep his dog on a lead in future. Dog owners should be aware that there are a number of deer in the Simonside woods and that failure to keep a dog under control can lead to incidents of concern, such as this one.

Operation Sanctuary

Operation Sanctuary is an investigation into allegations of a series of sexual offences predominantly within Newcastle, but also in other local authority areas, involving a number of

men from a range of communities and vulnerable female victims, including teenagers and young adults.

From a Coquetdale perspective, if any person presents as potentially vulnerable, whether walking home in the early hours, at a bus stop, on a caravan site, in a public house, B&B accommodation, or fly camping, please call Coquetdale Police.

The safeguarding of people in our community is a priority.
