

COMMUNITY MESSAGING IN NORTHUMBERLAND

BE INFORMED

Please find the following Coquetdale Community Message update covering the period 1st January to 1st February 2014. Six (6) x crimes were reported over this period:

Rothbury

Damage to Motor Vehicle and external fuel tank.

Occurred between 1200 hrs 01/01/14 to 1200 hrs 06/01/14 outside a garage premises situated in Rothbury.

A vehicle parked unattended had the tyres slashed and a fuel waste tank was also damaged.

Theft - Shoplifting Rothbury Co-op

Occurred 17/01/14 when a male entered the store and removed a bottle of wine.

This male 37 years from Wallsend, was stopped by police.

He accompanied police to the store, paid for the goods, apologised and was banned.

This process is known as a Community Resolution, where the victim and police deemed this action appropriate and proportionate.

South East Coquetdale

Burglary (Non Dwelling) Park Road, Swarland

Occurred from 2200 hrs 10/01/14 and 0900 hrs 11/01/14 when access to a garage was gained via. the side window.

A blue Draper welding unit and red Extreme hammer drill were stolen.

A second outer building was also entered. A glass panel and lock were damaged.

Criminal Damage Aln View, Old Swarland

Occurred between 1200 hrs 07/01/14 and 1200 hrs 13/01/14 when the property owner found some damage

to a lock at his workshop within the grounds of his property. OIC PC Kilburn

Coquetdale Police are continuing to focus on Swarland to ensure such property crimes are disrupted and cease.

North / North West Coquetdale

Theft of cable - Powburn (minor link road to Branton)

Occurred between 0800 hrs 15/01/14 and 1600 hrs 16/01/14

Ladders were used to climb a telegraph pole and cut live / earth cabling.

This process was then repeated at the next pole whereby over 400 metres of cable belonging to Northern Power Grid was stolen.

Theft of Sheep Burradon Farm, Netherton

Occurred from December 2013 to 28/01/14.

A large quantity of sheep have been removed believed by a vehicle, from Burradon Farm.

The stock stolen includes fifty (50) x new mule gimmers - flock number UK107378 with black markings (left back) and green markings (back rump).

Enquiries are on-going.

In summary, other than the recent spike in Swarland, crime remains low across Coquetdale. Police will continue to deter and disrupt any emerging crime or disorder trend.

Our resources will also target disorder caused by off road motor cycles in the remote upper valley areas.

Drink drivers will also be an area of continued focus, to ensure our roads remain safe.

Please pay attention to remote farming communities where recent metal and sheep thefts have occurred.

Always report anything suspicious via the 999 system.

If anyone has information on emerging crime or disorder, please contact Coquetdale Police.

Our aim is to initiate early interventions and where necessary involve partners, to disrupt and prevent escalation.
